About

Dr. Homi Bhabha State University, Mumbai (HBSU)

The Government of Maharashtra has established the Dr. Homi Bhabha State University, as a Cluster University in 2019, with the Institute of Science, Mumbai; Elphinstone College, Mumbai; Sydenham College, Mumbai; Secondary Training College, Mumbai; Institute of Forensic Science, Mumbai; and Sydenham Institute of Management Studies, Research and Entrepreneurship Education, Mumbai as the Constituent Colleges. The Institute of Science, Mumbai is the Lead Institute of the University. All the colleges are more than 100 years old; the youngest the Institute of Science was established in 1920; while the oldest the Elphinstone College was established in 1835.

The University is an independent degree granting entity with its own Rules and Regulations. This is the first University of its kind in the State of Maharashtra and is established as per the guidelines of Rashtriya Ucchatar Shiksha Abhiyan (RUSA). The establishment of this University is expected to charge the Higher Education system in the State with new vigour. It will lead to optimum use of resources of the constituent colleges and will offer the learners wide options of learning with flexibility and assist them with student-friendly support system. It will generate contemporary and relevant infrastructure and provide undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in diverse disciplines under choice based credit system (CBCS). The CBCS will adopt a cafeteria approach, where the students will be given freedom to select some courses from an array of courses as per their preferences. The students may take some of the courses across the constituent colleges. The programmes will be dynamic and demand driven. The students may participate in various activities organized by the constituent colleges.

Elphinstone College, Mumbai


The Elphinstone Institution was established in 1835 under the Bombay Native Education (Trust). The enlightened citizens of Mumbai collected a sum of Rs. 2,29,636 for the Institution and the name was given as a tribute to the departing Governor of Bombay, Mountstuart Elphinstone (6th October, 1779 – 20th November, 1859). The classes commenced in 1836 and Elphinstone college separated from the High School in 1856. Thus the college was established before the establishment of the University of Mumbai; and in fact in the inception stage the classes of the University used to be held at the college. The college occupies a unique position in the annals of higher education in the country. The building of the college with its Gothic architecture has been classified as a Grade I Heritage structure. The college was awarded the Asia-Pacific Heritage Award for Culture Heritage Conservation by the UNESCO. The college has a Library with rich collection of over one lakh books. It is accredited with Grade 'A' by the NAAC.

Sydenham College of Commerce and Economics, Mumbai



Credits Assigned by Virtue of Academic Education. All programs offered will have a minimum notional learning duration of 1,200 hours, equivalent to 40 credits per academic year. In addition to the flagship programs, a basket/pool of courses will be made available, keeping in view the needs of industry and user organizations. Students will also have the option to undertake additional courses, programs, subjects, or projects beyond the required 40–44 credits in order to earn additional credits. However, these additional credits earned will not be reflected on the official scorecard. The assignment of credits, as prescribed under the National Higher Education Qualifications Framework (NHEQF), applies to all streams, including Science, Commerce, Arts, and Multidisciplinary programs, and is detailed below under the NCrF levels and Credit Assignment in Higher Education.

RULES FOR ADMISSION

Eligibility

It should be noted that eligibility criteria vary slightly for each programme, and students are advised to check with the respective constituent colleges and their admission coordinators for detailed information.

However, the following basic rules apply:

- For all undergraduate programmes, passing the XII/HSC Board examination of the Maharashtra State Board of Secondary and Higher Secondary Education, Mumbai Divisional Board, or any other equivalent board (e.g., CBSE, ICSE, etc.) is mandatory.
- For B.Sc. programmes, a Science stream in Class XII is mandatory.
- For B.Com., students must have studied Science or Commerce in Class XII.
- For B.A., students from Science, Commerce, or Arts streams in Class XII are eligible.

Some programmes, such as B.Sc. Data Science or B.Sc. Artificial Intelligence, may require students who did not have Mathematics in Class XII to take a bridge course in Mathematics. Students are advised to confirm such requirements with the respective programme coordinators.

The M.A. in Applied Psychology (Clinical & Counseling Applications) requires the applicant to have completed at least three courses/papers in Psychology at the undergraduate level.

Applications from overseas students will be accepted only if they are forwarded with a recommendation letter from the Indian Diplomatic Mission in the applicant's country. Such applications must be accompanied by:

- 1. The final School/College Certificate Examination mark sheet,
- 2.A testimonial from the Principal of the School/College regarding the applicant's character, and
- 3. A Provisional Eligibility Certificate.

Documents to be Submitted with the Application Form

- 1. Original mark sheet of H.S.C. / I.S.C. / C.B.S.E. / Graduation or any equivalent examination, along with a photocopy.
- 2. College / School Leaving Certificate or No Objection Certificate (NOC).
- 3. Provisional / Final Eligibility Certificate (for students from boards/universities other than the Maharashtra H.S.C. Board or Mumbai University).
- 4. Migration Certificate, wherever applicable.
- 5. Attested copy of Caste Certificate (for Reserved Category students).
- 6. Non-Creamy Layer Certificate, wherever applicable.
- 7. Attested copy of Validity Certificate (for Reserved Category students).
- 8. Income Certificate, wherever applicable.
- 9. Gap Certificate, if there is a break in education.
- 10. Disability Certificate (for Divyang/Persons with Disabilities, if applicable).
- 11. Undertaking (anti-ragging, etc.). Declaration Form signed by the student and parent/guardian.
- 12. Foreign/NRI students must submit Passport copy, Student Visa copy

RULES OF DISCIPLINE AND CODE OF CONDUCT FOR LEARNERS

1. Attendance

- A minimum of 75% attendance in lectures, practicals, and tutorials is compulsory for all courses.
- A learner who is irregular in attendance or fails to complete academic responsibilities to the satisfaction of the Principal is liable for cancellation of terms.
- Learners who do not meet the minimum 75% attendance requirement for each semester, or who do not show satisfactory academic progress in internal/semester examinations, will not be permitted to appear for the semester-end examinations.
- Periodical tests, assignments, seminars, and examinations are compulsory for learners of all classes.
- A learner who remains absent for any periodical test, assignment, or examination due to illness must submit a medical certificate, along with an application endorsed by a parent/guardian.
- A learner who remains absent due to participation in NSS/NCC activities must inform the Head of Department (HoD) / Principal in advance, and submit the necessary supporting documents.
- Learners unable to maintain the required attendance due to illness or participation in events at the state/national level must apply in writing to the Principal for leave of absence. The final decision in such matters will be taken by the Principal or Director, Board of Examinations and Evaluation (BOEE).
- All leave applications, along with relevant documents such as medical certificates, must be submitted to the Principal and not directly to any faculty member.
- All decisions regarding the grant of terms will be based on the recommendation of the College Attendance Committee, and the Principal's final approval.

2. Examination

- Candidate arriving at the examination hall after 30 minutes or more of the commencement of an examination shall not be allowed to appear for the examination.
- No candidate shall be permitted to leave until half an hour is over after the question papers have been distributed.
- Possession of mobile phone during examination is strictly prohibited.
- No pages shall be torn off from the answer book given to the candidates.
- Nothing shall be written on the question paper.
- Exchange of written materials, stencils, mathematical instruments, etc is strictly prohibited.
- Any use of unfair-means during the examination is liable to severe penalties as per the University rules.

3. Discipline

- **Identity Card:** Learners must wear their valid college identity card at all times while on campus. It must be produced on demand by any member of the college staff. Entry without a valid ID card is strictly prohibited.
- Responsibility for College Property: Learners are responsible for the upkeep
 of college property including the buildings, classrooms, furniture, gardens, and
 plants. Any damage caused will have to be compensated either individually or
 collectively.
- Entry of Outsiders: No learner shall bring outsiders into the college premises. In special cases, parents or guardians may be permitted, provided prior permission is taken and their names are recorded at the entrance gate.
- **Guest Speakers and Visitors:** No individual other than college staff may be invited to address meetings or participate in activities without the prior written approval of the Principal.
- **Loitering:** Learners are not permitted to loiter in the corridors or elsewhere in the college premises during lecture hours.
- Smoking Prohibited: Smoking is strictly prohibited on the college campus.
- **Collection of Money:** No learner shall collect funds, sponsorships, or donations from any source without the written permission of the Principal.

- **Notice Board Usage:** No notice, circular, or communication may be displayed on notice boards or blackboards without prior written approval of the Principal or designated faculty member.
- **Organization of Activities:** All student-related activities, meetings, events, gatherings, picnics, excursions, and hikes must be organized only with prior written permission of the Principal.
- **Communication of Notices:** All important information related to examinations, academic activities, and other announcements will be displayed on the college notice boards. Learners are expected to check notices regularly. Ignorance of notices will not be considered an excuse.
- Energy Conservation: Learners must ensure that lights, fans, and other electrical appliances are switched off when not in use, and also when leaving classrooms, laboratories, or the library.
- Awareness of Rules: Learners are expected to familiarize themselves with all college rules and regulations, including any circulars issued from time to time.
- Acceptance of Rules: By enrolling in the college, learners are deemed to have accepted and agreed to abide by all rules and regulations of the institution, to the entire satisfaction of the college authorities.

4. Mobile Phone

Misuse of mobile phones within the campus is strictly prohibited. If Any learner found misusing a mobile phone will have the device forfeited, and strict disciplinary action will be taken against the learner.

5. Dress Code

It is mandatory for a learner to come in formal and decent dress only.

6. Ragging is Strictly Prohibited -

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within and outside the college premises. The Government of Maharashtra has declared ragging a cognizable offence, and any individual found guilty of engaging in ragging will face severe disciplinary and legal action. Learners are strictly advised not to indulge in any act of ragging, directly or indirectly.

The college has constituted an Anti-Ragging Committee to address any grievances related to ragging. Students are encouraged to report any incident of ragging to the committee or any faculty member without fear.

Ragging is a punishable offence. Say NO to Ragging.

FACILITIES FOR STUDENT-SUPPORT

Dr. Homi Bhabha State University is committed to ensuring the holistic development of its students. A range of student support facilities are made available to enhance academic, physical, and personal well-being.

1. Hostel Facility

- Boys' Hostel: Seats are reserved for male students of Dr. Homi Bhabha State University in the Government Hostel located at Churchgate (C Road). Students must apply online to the Joint Director, Higher Education, Mumbai for hostel admission.
- Girls' Hostel: Seats are similarly reserved for female students at the Telang Memorial Girls' Hostel, also located at Churchgate (C Road). The online application is to be submitted to the Joint Director, Higher Education.

2. Sports & Physical Education / Gymkhana

The University has signed an MoU with the University of Mumbai, granting access to its extensive sports facilities. Additionally:

- Elphinstone College has a dedicated cricket pitch at the Oval Ground, located within walking distance from the campus.
- Facilities for volleyball and basketball are available within the college premises.
- Indoor games such as table tennis, carrom, and chess are also accessible to students.
- The Gymkhanas of all constituent colleges are open to students and promote active participation in intercollegiate sports.
- The Department of Physical Education maintains a well-equipped First Aid Box with essential and life-saving medicines.
- Yoga sessions are regularly organized to promote mental and physical wellbeing.

3. Knowledge Resource Centre (Library)

- Grievances and suggestions submitted are processed regularly for timely redressal. Constructive suggestions are reviewed for implementation by the administration.

6. Women Development Cell
